

Lecture Two: Basic Greetings and Everyday Expressions

Objectives: By the end of this lecture, students will be able to:

- use simple greetings in everyday situations.
- respond appropriately to basic expressions.
- introduce themselves and others.

In English, we **greet** someone by saying: Hello – Hi – Good morning - Good afternoon - Good evening – Good night.

There are some **everyday expressions** used by English people, such as thanks, please, excuse me,...)

➤ Greeting

A: Hello. I'm Lisa.

B: Hello. I'm Marek.

➤ Say your name

Sandra: Hello. I'm Sandra. What's your name?

Hiro: My name's Hiro

➤ How are you?

Sandra: Hi, John. How are you?

John: Fine/ very well, thanks, Sandra. And you?

Sandra: I'm OK/ I'm fine, thanks.

➤ Where are you from?

Hiro: Where are you from Sandra?

Sandra: I'm from Spain. Where are you from?

Hiro: I'm from Japan. From Tokyo
