<p><b>Dialogue 1: Asking for Directions</b> Traveler: Excuse me. Where is the train station? Local: It's two blocks away, next to the bank. Traveler: Thank you very much. Local: You're welcome. Have a nice day!</p>	<p><b>Dialogue 2: Checking in at a Hotel</b> Guest: Hello. I have a reservation. Receptionist: Great! What's your name? Guest: Anna Lee. Two nights. Receptionist: Yes, we have your booking. Here is your key. Guest: Thank you!</p>

**Joe:** A window seat, please.

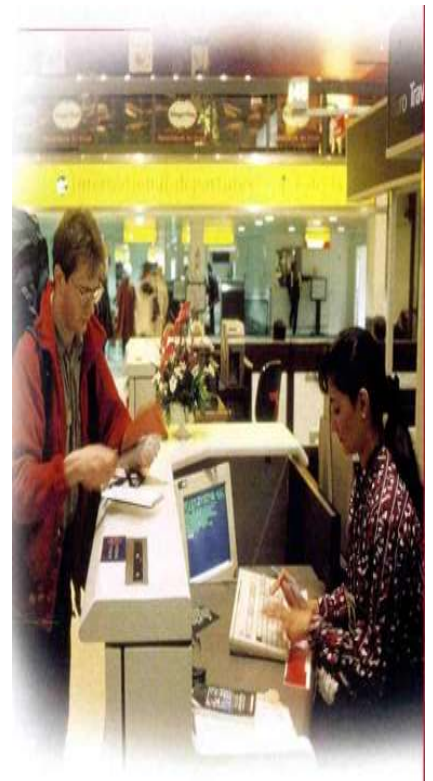
**Woman:** OK. Here's your **boarding card**. You're in seat **16A**.
